Perdue Farms

Perdue Farms is the family-owned company behind the PERDUE® brand, the number-one brand of premium fresh chicken in the United States. The PERDUE® brand also extends across a growing roster of retail food products, combining Perdue's reputation for quality with convenience, and reaching customers across the country. Perdue foodservice products are distributed nationally to leading restaurant chains and distributors, and Perdue's International channel distributes food products around the globe.

Our poultry operations are fully integrated, including the breeding, hatching, humane raising and feeding of our chickens; food processing operations; and our distribution and transportation network.

Perdue AgriBusiness

Perdue AgriBusiness ranks among the top U.S. grain companies and is a direct exporter of U.S. agricultural commodities through the company's deepwater port in the Mid-Atlantic. Perdue AgriBusiness purchases grain from local farmers and dealers, merchandises grain and oilseeds, processes soybeans, operates protein conversion plants and refines edible oils. With an entrepreneurial spirit, Perdue AgriBusiness ventures touch such diverse opportunities as ag services, organic fertilizers and specialty livestock feeds.

ABOUT THE NUMBERS

- Numbers in this report cover the 12-month period ending December 31, 2010.
- Salary and wages and producer payment numbers for each state reflect payments made to associates and producers living in those states.
- Salary and wages and producer payment numbers for each location reflect the actual expense. Thus, the numbers include salaries and wages to associates residing outside the state but working at the facility, and to producers who raise birds for the facility but whose farms may be located in an adjoining state.
- Because of the integrated nature of our business and the geographic locations of our operations, some poultry complexes include facilities, such as hatcheries and feed mills, that support the complex but may be located in an adjoining state. The economic impact of those facilities are reported as part of the complex total.
- Fuel taxes are not available on a location-by-location basis and are not reflected in the local tax figures.
- Community Impact is estimated by using a multiplier of three, which is a generally accepted industry practice.

Perdue’s operations in Alabama include the Dothan processing complex and live production, including hatcheries in Dothan and Samson, and grain storage in Geneva.

The Dothan Processing Complex produces whole, cut-up, deboned, and sliced chicken products for foodservice customers and for Perdue’s further-processing and cooking plants.

The complex includes the processing plant, hatcheries, truck garage and wastewater pretreatment plant in Dothan; a hatchery in Samson; and feed mill and live production in DeFuniak Springs, Fla. An onsite Wellness Center provides primary care to employees and their covered dependents.

Perdue-Dothan is a member of the Dothan area Chamber of Commerce. Through company donations and associate involvement, the operation supports several local school programs, summer softball programs, the Dothan Fire Department, Salvation Army, American Red Cross, American Heart Association, United Way, Relay for Life, March of Dimes and Boys and Girls Clubs, among others.

Perdue’s operations in Delaware include the Georgetown and Milford processing complexes, Georgetown distribution center, the Perdue-AgriRecycle litter recycling plant near Seaford, grain receiving and storage in Bridgeville and Seaford, and the Venture Milling feed-ingredient-blending operation in Seaford.

The Georgetown Complex produces PERDUE® Oven-STUFFER® Roaster and PERDUE® Oven-READY™ Roaster whole birds, roaster tray-pack products and private-label roasters for retail customers and supplies roaster meat to Perdue’s cooking plants.

The complex includes the processing plant in Georgetown, a wastewater treatment plant and truck garage, a feed mill in Bridgeville, as well as a hatchery in Salisbury, Md. Numbers above also reflect the Georgetown Distribution Center. A Wellness Center at the plant site provides primary care to associates and their dependents.

Perdue’s Georgetown Complex offers support through discounted product and associate involvement to Toys for Tots, Delaware Food Bank (via an employee food drive), La Esperanza, Georgetown Little League, Milford Veterans Home, local Boys and Girls Club, March of Dimes, El Centro Cultural, Chad Spicer Fund, the Georgetown Fire Department, Delaware Hospice Christmas tree, Georgetown Public Library and the United Way, among others. Georgetown associates have also volunteered in the local community at the Delmarva Chicken Festival, Georgetown Easter Egg Hunt, Georgetown Christmas Parade and Project Clean Stream. The Georgetown Distribution Center also handles much of Perdue’s product donations to Feeding America and its network of community food banks.

The processing plant has achieved numerous awards for million-safe-hour milestones.

The Milford Complex produces PERDUE® TENDER ‘n’ TASTY® whole birds and tray-pack broiler parts for retail customers. The complex includes a processing plant in Milford, Del., as well as a hatchery and feed mill in Hurlock, Md. A Wellness Center at the plant site provides primary care to associates and their dependents.

Through company donations and associate involvement, the Milford Complex supports the United Way, Delaware Advocates for Limited Proficiency Students, Delaware State Police, Delaware Early Childhood Center, American Cancer Society Relay for Life, Milford Boys and Girls Clubs, Meals on Wheels, the Milford Volunteer Fire Department, Kent Sussex Industries (KSI) Milford Parks and Recreation, the Milford Hospital Fair, Milford FFA and Feeding America, among others.

The Milford Complex has been recognized by the State of Delaware for its contribution to adult and family literacy through its ESL (English as a Second Language) classes. The Delmarva Safety Association has recognized the complex’s safety record.

The Perdue Perry processing complex produces PERDUE® TENDER’n TASTY® whole birds and tray-pack products and PERDUE® and private-label individually-quick-frozen products for retail distribution; marinated and portion-control breast filets and tenders for foodservice customers; leg quarters and paws for export; and raw materials, including boneless breast, for the Perry cooking operation and other Perdue cooking plants.

The Perdue Perry cooking plant produces fully-cooked, frozen poultry products for foodservice and retail customers. The complex includes the Perry processing plant, Perry cook plant and the Southeast Distribution center; plus a feed mill and hatchery in Forsyth, and an onsite wastewater treatment plant. Wellness Centers at both the processing and cooking plants provide primary health care to associates.

The Perry processing plant was named “2005 Employer of the Year” by the Georgia Department of Labor, and the processing and cooking plants were jointly named Refrigerated and Frozen Food magazine’s “Food Plant of the Year” in 2006. The Perry wastewater operations received a 2011 U.S. Poultry & Egg Association Clean Water Award.

Perdue’s operations in Indiana include a turkey processing complex in Washington, a turkey hatchery in Vincennes, a turkey breeder operations in Lebanon, and turkey breeder and research farms. Perdue also operates a feed mill and grain elevator in Daviess County.

The Perdue Washington Turkey Processing Complex provides raw materials for foodservice and retail items produced at Perdue’s further processing and cooking plants. The plant also produces ready-to-cook fresh products for retail distribution, including boneless breast, ground turkey, turkey burgers and turkey sausage.

The complex includes the processing plant, feed mill and garage; and a hatchery in Vincennes. A Wellness Center adjacent to the processing plant provides primary health care to associates and their dependents.

Through company donations and associate involvement, the Washington Complex supports the Daviess County Community Foundation, Montgomery Ruritan, Odon Lions Club, local schools, the YMCA, local 4-H and Young Farmers groups, Feeding America and United Way, among others.

Perdue’s operations in Kentucky include a poultry processing complex, a hatchery and a distribution center in Cromwell. The company also has a feed mill, grain receiving facility and barge dock in Livermore; grain receiving in Winchester, Franklin, Allensville and grow-out and breeder offices in Beaver Dam.

The Perdue Cromwell Complex produces whole bird and tray-pack broiler products for retail customers in the Midwest and provides raw material to Perdue’s cooking operations.

The complex, which began operation in 1996, includes the processing plant, a hatchery and wastewater plant, as well as a feed mill in Livermore and grow-out offices in Beaver Dam. The site also includes a Distribution Center. A Wellness Center at the plant provides primary health care to associates.

The Perdue Cromwell Complex supports local schools and parks, the United Way, American Cancer Society Relay for Life, Together We Care, Ohio County Senior Services, Taste of Ohio County, Ohio County Fair, Ohio County Sheriff’s Office, Bill Monroe Festival, Battle of Sacramento, Kentucky State Police – Trooper Island, Ohio County Longest Day of Play, Sparks in the Park, Kentucky and Ohio County Future Farmers of America and Feeding America. The Cromwell Complex is also an active member of the Kentucky Poultry Federation and the Ohio County Chamber of Commerce.

Perdue’s Cromwell Complex has received the Governor’s Citation through the Kentucky Commission on Community volunteerism and Services. The Cromwell Complex also received the Governor’s Safety & Health Award for achieving more than 3.5 consecutive safe production hours.

Perdue was founded in Salisbury, Md., and remains headquartered there. The company’s Salisbury operations include the corporate office, technical services laboratories, grain receiving (including a barge dock on the Wicomico River) facilities, grain storage, soybean crushing and edible oil refinery, feed mill, hatcheries, transportation offices and fleet maintenance garage, live production office, training center and Salisbury processing plant. The company’s new product research and development facilities are housed at the Innovation Center, also in Salisbury.

Other Maryland facilities include a feed mill in Hurlock; research farms; primary breeder facilities; and grain receiving and storage facilities Berlin, Bishop, Easton, Hurlock, Linkwood, Lothian, Lynch, Northeast, Roberts, Shiloh, Crumpton, Keymar and Sudlersville.

The Perdue Salisbury Processing Plant produces ice-pack broiler and cornish for the East Coast market. The plant, purchased in 1968, was the company’s first processing plant.

Through company contributions and associate involvement, the Salisbury Processing Plant supports the United Way, American Cancer Society Relay for Life, March of Dimes and the University of Maryland Eastern Shore, among others. The plant’s March of Dimes team is consistently one of the area’s top fund-raising teams.

Perdue AgriBusiness' Maryland operations include the company headquarters in Salisbury, soybean crushing and edible oil refinery in Salisbury, Salisbury barge dock, the Curtis Bay barge dock and grain receiving and storage facilities in Berlin, Bishop, Easton, Hurlock, Linkwood, Lothian, Lynch, Northeast, Roberts, Shiloh, Crumpton, Keymar and Sudlersville.

Perdue AgriBusiness supports the Maryland Food Bank and the Blood Bank of Delmarva.

Perdue’s operations in North Carolina include processing complexes in Lewiston and Rockingham and a cooking plant in Concord; breeder operations in Nashville, Statesville and Yadkinville; hatcheries in Eagle Springs, Halifax, Kenly, Murfreesboro and Norlina; feed mills in Cofield, Eagle Springs, Elkin and Nashville; and Venture Milling’s operation in Ansonville. Grain receiving and storage locations include an elevator and barge dock in Belhaven and elevators in Chadbourn, Cleveland, Cofield, Elkin, Greenville, Lumberton, Nashville, Pantego, Wilson, Elizabeth City and Plymouth.
